Strong Q2; downgrade to HOLD on rich valuations

- Reported strong performance for core pipe as well as the domestic adhesive business in Q2
- Maintain the guidance of growing pipe volume at a double-digit rate with EBITDA margin of 16-18% in FY26
- Downgrade from BUY to HOLD as the stock appears to be fairly valued post a sharp run-up over the past 3 months; TP up by 13% to Rs 1,700

Strong Q2: ASTRA beats our estimates for Q2FY26 (Revenue: +11.4%; EBITDA: +22.7%; PAT: +36.0%) due to strong pipe sales volume (+20.6% YoY vs +7.0% estimated) as well as improved performance of its domestic adhesives business. ASTRA revenue/EBITDA/APAT grew by 15.1%/22.2%/26.9% YoY in Q2FY26.

Highlights: ASTRA has reported superior pipe volume growth vs Supreme (ASTRA: +20.6%; SI: +17.2%) for the first time over the past 4 years period due to market share gain, on account of aggressive pricing policy, geographical expansion with decentralised operation and production portfolio expansion. Furthermore, the company has reported healthy pipe segment margin (+88bps YoY to 17.9%) in Q2FY26 in a tough environment due to rise in share of value-added products. Resinova EBITDA grew sharply by 23.9% YoY in Q2 driven by higher revenue (+15.8%) and improved margin (+111bps YoY to 17.0%). SEAL IT revenue grew at a muted pace of 5.2% YoY with improved margin (+930bps YoY to 7.3%) in Q2. Paint revenue grew at a sharp pace of 17.1% YoY in Q2.

Outlook: ASTRA has maintained its guidance of growing the pipe volume at a double-digit rate with EBITDA margin of 16-18% in FY26. Resinova revenue is targeted to grow at 15% rate with EBITDA margin of 15-16% in FY26. Management expects the performance of SEAL IT and paints business to turn around in the coming quarters. Capex guidance has remained unchanged at Rs 3.0-3.5bn for FY26 (vs Rs 2.82bn spent in H1FY26). The proposed CPVC resin facility is expected to become operational by Q2FY27 onwards.

Downgrade from BUY to HOLD; TP raise by 13% to Rs 1,700: We expect ASTRA EPS to grow at a strong 20.3% CAGR with a healthy ROE of 16.5% over FY25-FY28E. However, we downgrade our rating from BUY to HOLD, as we believe the stock is richly valued (the stock trades at 59.6x on 1Y forward P/E vs 5Y pre-Covid average of 45.0x) post 14% run-up in the stock over the past 3 months. We have raised our TP to Rs 1,700 per share (Rs 1,500 earlier) due to EPS upgrade (+6.3%/+7.2%/+7.2 for FY26E/FY27E/FY28E), based on strong Q2 result. Our target P/E multiple remains unchanged at 55x on Sep'27 estimate (Jun'27 earlier).

Earnings Call Highlights

- Pipe demand scenario: Pipe demand was weak in Q2FY26 due to weak construction activity on account of heavy monsoons and low government spending. Post-monsoon construction activities have picked up in Oct'25. Management expects the demand in H2FY26 to be better than H1FY26.
- Polymer price scenario: ASTRA noted that polymer prices remained volatile and dipped in Q2FY26. Management expects ADD announcement by Nov 12, 2025, which could lead to short-term hike in PVC prices by Rs 5-6/kg.
- Pipes segment: Volume increased sharply by 20.6% YoY in Q2FY26 wing to market share gain on account of aggressive pricing policy, geographical expansion with de-centralised operation and production portfolio expansion. Pipe segment EBITDA margin improved by 90bps YoY to 18.5% in Q2FY26 due to better mix. Going ahead, the company maintains its guidance of growing the pipe volume at a double-digit rate with EBITDA margin of 16-18% in FY26.
- Resinova: Revenue grew by 15.8% YoY in Q2FY26. Division EBITDA margin improved by 111bps YoY to 17.0% in Q2FY26. Management is focused on growing market share by entering new geographies, new product introduction and focus on rural markets. Going ahead, the company targets the division to grow at 15% YoY with EBITDA margin of 15-16% in FY26.
- SEAL IT: Revenue grew at a muted pace of 5.2% in Q2FY26. Division EBITDA margin improved sharply by 930bps YoY to 7.3% in Q2FY26 owing to a low base. ASTRA has increased its stake in this division from 95% to 100% in Q2FY26. The company has hired a new CEO (with 25 years of experience). The division is recovering gradually on the improvement of order inflows and new project acceptance. ASTRAL expects substantial improvement in both margins and growth by the end of FY26 and returning to double-digit EBITDA margin in FY27.
- Paints: Revenue grew at a healthy rate of 17.1% YoY in Q2FY26. The company recently opened 9 new depots across Gujarat, Rajasthan, and Maharashtra, resulting in increased employee and operational costs that temporarily pressured margin in Q2FY26. Management targets the division revenue to grow at 20% YoY in FY26. Division margin is expected to be in single-digit level in FY27.
- Bathware: Revenue grew by 13.8% YoY in Q2FY26.
- Capex: ASTRA has maintained its capex guidance of Rs 3.0-3.5bn for FY26 (spent Rs 2.82bn in H1FY26).
- Channel Inventory: Remains low given the volatile resin prices, leading to subdued stocking sentiment. Management expects restocking to occur post the ADD announcement, which could spike the near-term demand.
- Net Cash: has gone down from Rs 4.64bn in Mar'25 to Rs 4.0 bn in Sep'25.



Fig 3 – ASTRA pipe volume grew at a strong pace of 20.6% YoY in Q2FY26

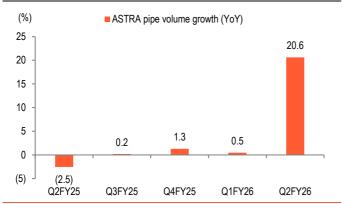
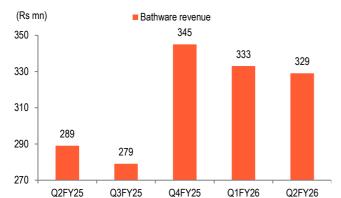
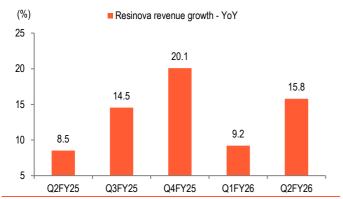


Fig 5 – Bathware revenue grew by 13.8% YoY in Q2FY26 over a small base



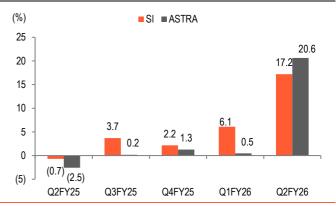

Fig 7 – Resinova revenue grew at a healthy pace of 15.8% YoY in Q2FY26



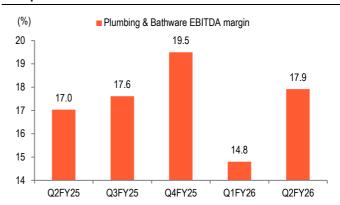

Fig 4 – ASTRA reported superior pipe YoY volume growth vs SI for the first time over 4 years



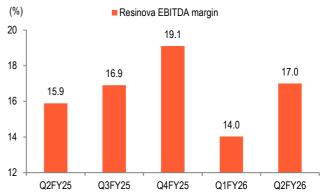

Fig 9 – Paints revenue was up 17.1% YoY in Q2FY26 on a low base

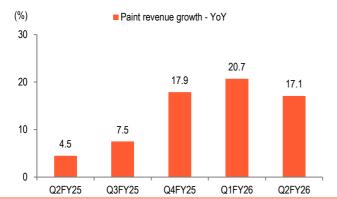
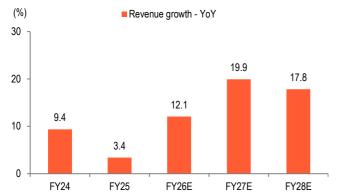
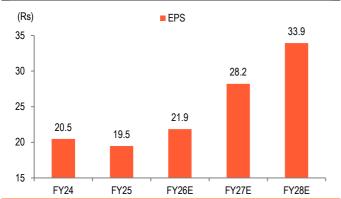


Fig 11 – ASTRA's revenue is projected to grow at 16.6% CAGR over FY25-FY28E



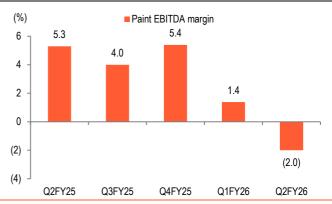

Fig 13 – EPS projected to grow at 20.3% CAGR over FY25-FY28E



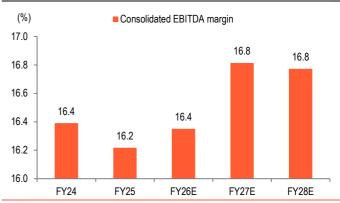

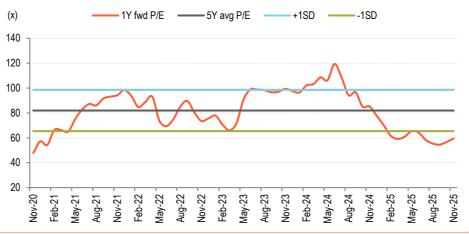
